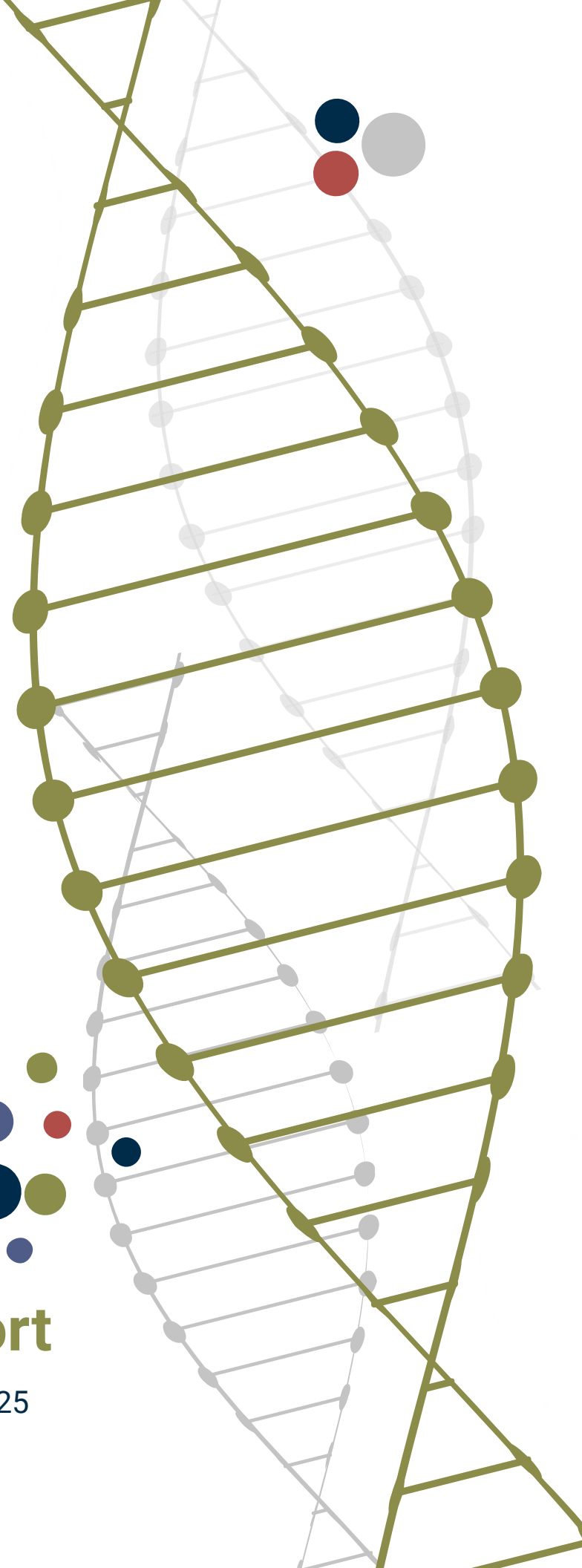
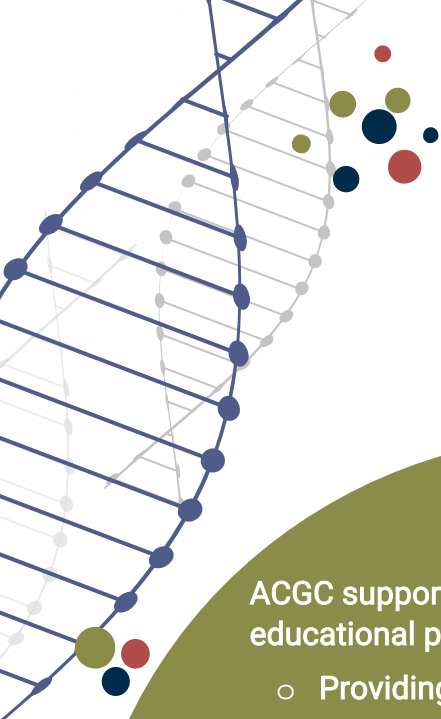

ACGC supports the development of quality educational programs in genetic counseling by:

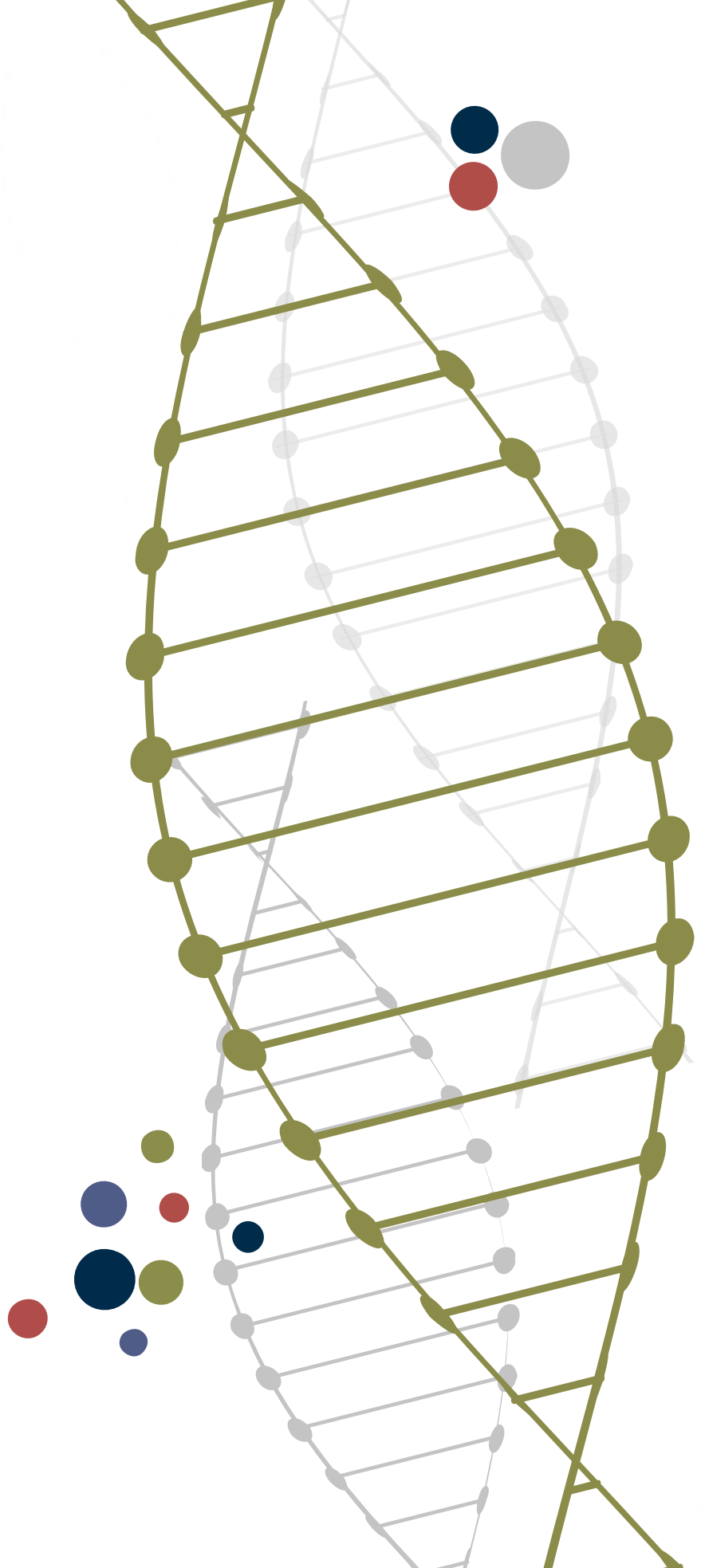
- Providing visionary leadership and excellent communication

- Assessing quality based on educational outcomes

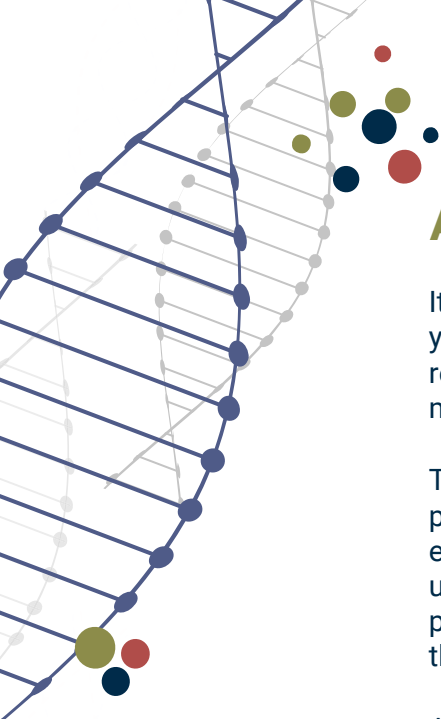

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ACGC PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It has been my honor to serve as President of the ACGC for 2025/26. This has been a year of extraordinary efforts — and significant challenge — and I am proud of the resilience, thoughtfulness, and integrity shown by our Board, Executive Office, and the many volunteers who make our mission possible.

This year brought serious external pressures on multiple fronts. Threats to DEIJ principles in accreditation standards, combined with federal changes to financial aid eligibility affecting how professional programs are classified, created a volatile and unpredictable environment for higher education and genetic counseling training programs. ACGC will continue to monitor developments and update our guidance as the landscape evolves.

A defining achievement of 2025 was the completion of our Standards revision — a monumental undertaking that reflects the efforts to modernize genetic counseling training while adapting to the changing realities our programs and students face. We are incredibly grateful to the Standards Committee for their wholehearted commitment and thoughtful engagement, and to the more than 400 individuals who responded during the public comment period. Your participation ensures that our Standards remain rigorous, relevant, and positioned for the future.

This year, we also placed strong emphasis on developing expanded resources for our volunteers and training programs — from process flowcharts and updated review manuals to new policies on site visits, remediation, and inactive status. The addition of the volunteer database to Armature was a particular milestone. Our Board relies on volunteers for their "boots on the ground" perspective in reaccreditation review, and investing in their support means investing in the integrity of the accreditation process itself.

I would also like to extend our deepest gratitude to Joe Jackson, whose leadership as Executive Director has been instrumental in guiding ACGC to the stable position it holds today. With Joe's retirement as of March 1st, we are thrilled to congratulate Angela Bond on her appointment as Managing Director. Angela's commitment to high-quality customer service, investment in our work, and broader knowledge base make her an indispensable part of this organization. We have every confidence in Angela's leadership in the years ahead.

ACGC remains steadfast in its mission to advance quality in genetic counseling education. I am grateful to everyone who contributes to this work — your dedication is the foundation of everything we accomplish.

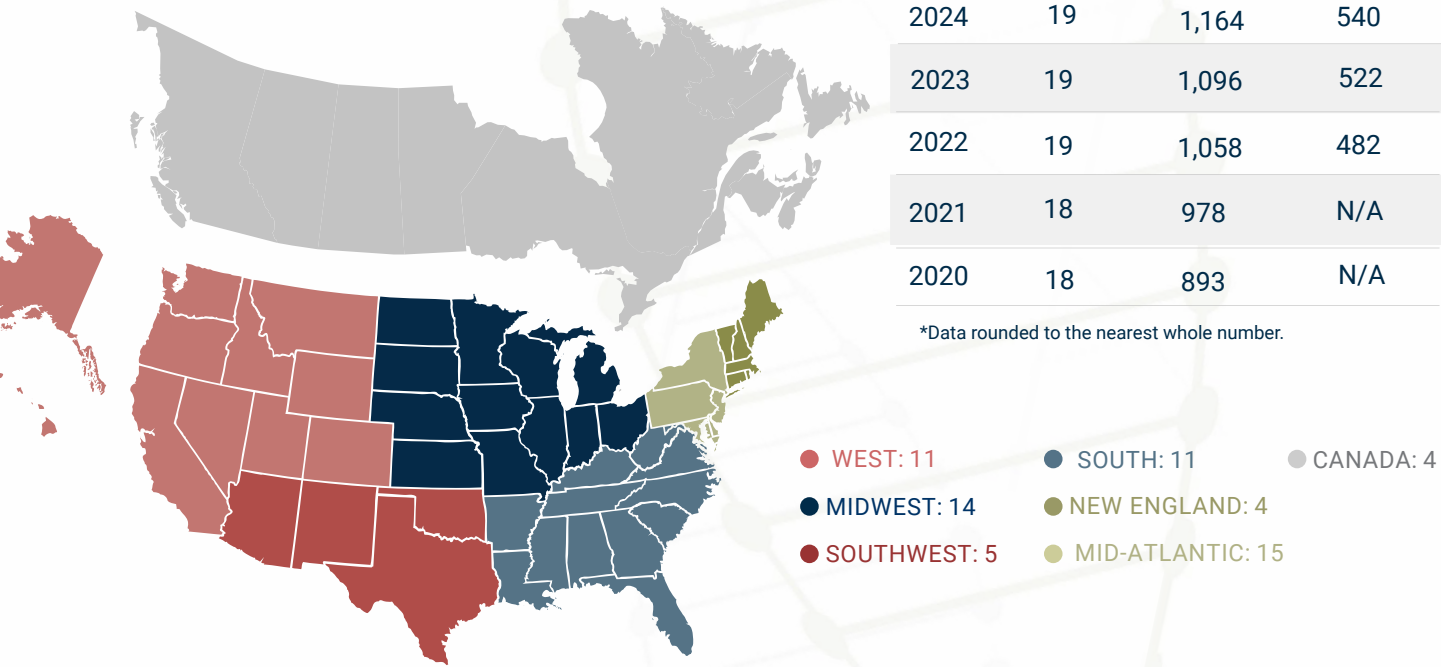
PROGRAM ACCREDITATION STATISTICS

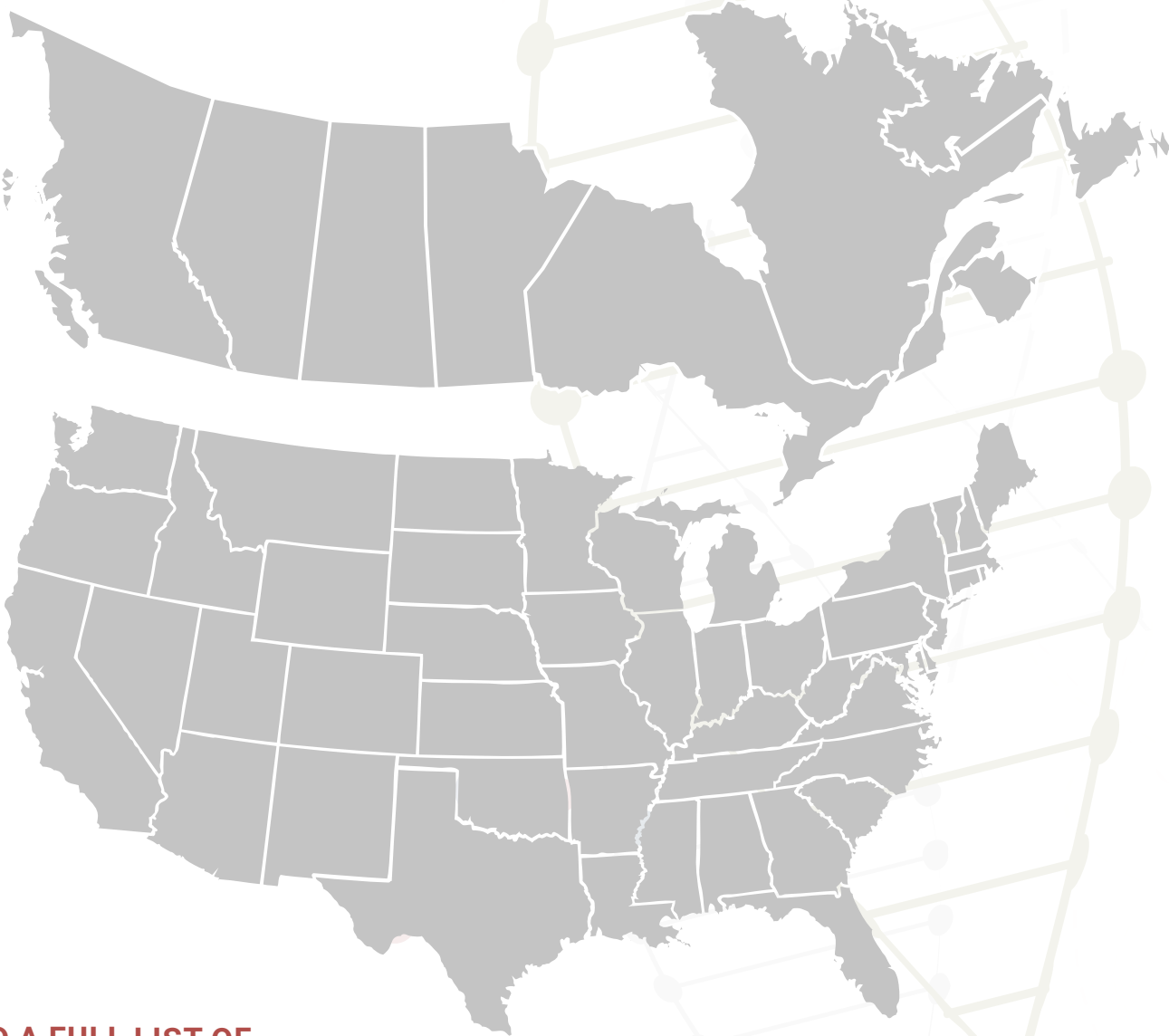
2025 REACCREDITATION

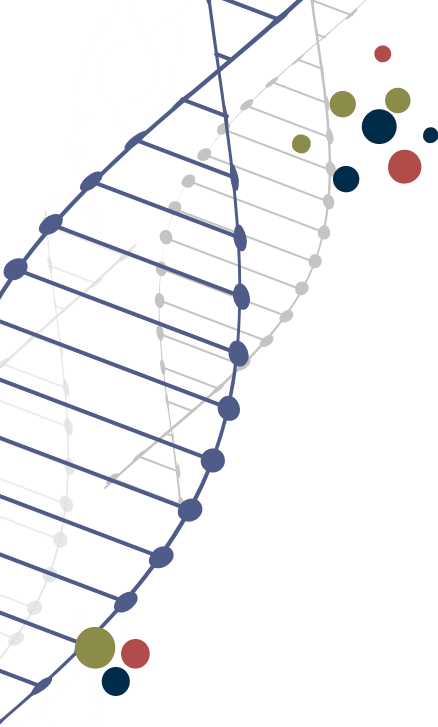
